

SELANGOR: Fast Facts

The area, population, economy, transportation, sea and rail links are all vital criteria to be considered before any investment. Here we highlight some major facts for consideration.

Area and Population

- Area = 796,084 hectares
- District = 9
- Population = 4,850.1 million
- Density = 5.01 per ha
- Infant mortality rate at 3.7 per 1,000 live births

Economy

- Selangor's GDP growth rate in 2006 was 6.1%
- Sectoral contribution to Selangor's GDP in 2006:
Industrial sector: 58.2% or (2005:57.9%)
Main sector: 2.9% (2005: 3.0%)
Service sector 45.2% (2005:45.3%)
- The employment rate in 2006 is 4.0% (2005:3.5%)

Transportation

Sea Link

Port Klang is the country's largest port, which comprises of the North Port, South Port and West Port in Pulau Indah.

Rail Link

Major rail network that links Kuala Lumpur to Port Klang (west), Rawang (north) and Seremban (south).

- Light Rail Transit System – linking Kuala Lumpur to conurbation areas in Selangor
- Express Rail Link – Linking KL Sentral to Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA)

Air Link

Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) in Sepang is fully equipped with some of the most modern and technologically advanced facilities.

Located 50 kilometres south of Malaysia's federal capital of Kuala Lumpur, KLIA has a capacity of 25 million passengers and 650,000 tonnes of cargo per year. Cargo import and export procedures are fully automated at KLIA to cut down delivery time.

Within a short span of two years since

its opening, KLIA was ranked number one for overall business passenger satisfaction in an International Air Transport Association (AITA) survey.

Road Transportation Network

Major trunk roads and expressways pass through Selangor, making the state easily accessible to all parts of the Peninsular. Access is available from a developed road network, comprising of 17 highways and expressways.

- Federal Highway – Linking Kuala Lumpur to Port Klang
- North Klang Valley Expressway (NKVE) – From Bukit Raja to Kuala Lumpur, connecting North South Highway
- Shah Alam Expressway – Alternate route between Port Klan and Kuala Lumpur.
- South Klang Valley Expressway (KESAS) – Linking Port Klang to KLIA and Sepang.
- North South Link – Linking NKVE to KLIA and also to the Northern and Southern states in Peninsular Malaysia.
- Coastal Highway – Linking Port Klang to Lumut in Perak.
- Guthrie Corridor Expressway (GCE) linking to North South Expressway and North Klang Valley Expressway.
